The Search for Surviving Family in Eastern Europe after the Holocaust

Prof. Natalia Aleksiun

Natalia Aleksiun is a Professor of Modern Jewish History at the Graduate School of Jewish Studies, Touro College New York. She published Where to? The Zionist Movement in Poland, 1944-1950 and co-edited two volumes of Polin, examining Holocaust memory and Jewish historiography in Eastern Europe. In 2019, she published a critical edition of The Destruction of the Jews of Żółkiew by Gerszon Taffet, one of the earliest Holocaust monographs. Her book Conscious History: Polish Jewish Historians before the Holocaust is forthcoming this year. She is preparing a volume of Polin devoted to Jewish childhoods, children, and child-rearing in Eastern Europe. She is currently a Gerda Henkel Fellow at Imre Kertész Kolleg in Jena, completing a book on Jewish medical students in East Central Europe.

Michel Kichka is the author of the graphic novel Second Generation: The Things I Didn't Tell My Father. Born in Belgium, he immigrated to Israel in 1974 and graduated with a degree in Graphic Design from the Bezalel Academy of Arts, Jerusalem in 1978. He works as a freelance illustrator for the press and children's books, as well as a political cartoonist for Israeli and international media. Kichka is a professor of cartoons, comics and illustration at the Bezalel Academy of Design, Jerusalem. He is a member of "Cartooning for Peace," and his work has been featured in solo and group exhibitions in Israel, France, Belgium, Turkey, the USA, Switzerland, Norway, Sweden, New Zealand, Italy, Germany, Poland and other countries.
